Other business: Theona Wheelock mentioned that thanks needs to be given to Claudia Steele for all her hard work in being Treasurer and also doing all the canning and preserving for the farm store. Last year there was a shortage of canning jars and all went above and beyond to find them. A round of thanks was given.

- We are partnering with "Mon Soleil Farm" as a pickup point for their CSA. This program brings all kinds of produce to the CSA clients and the "extras" can be found for sale in our store.
- We continued our own "home grown" events. The Chicken Run continues
 to be a popular spring event. Due to COVID concerns we canceled the
 Harvest Fest last fall, but it is on our schedule for this October. We have
 introduced our "Sundays at the Farm" program, mixing special events with
 farm animal visits. Something for everyone who stops by.
- Strong Family Farm continues to be good stewards of our "heritage." We are working with a farmer to bring back the parcel on West Road into a farmable field and continue the farming on the Route 30 parcel. We are expanding the useable acreage on the Route 30 site and looking to preserve the Red Barn.
- The backyard chicken program continues. The chickens are learning experience every year and an attraction for every visitor.
- Our bees are prospering this year. We have 3 healthy and productive hives.

We will continue to progress thanks to all of our supporters. But let us remember what came before us and bring that strength, direction, focus, hard work and thought into the future. We have an organization that we can be proud of, the Town of Vernon can be proud of and, if I dare say, Norman and Geraldine Strong would be proud of. We reap what we have sown and the Strong Family Farm is the result of what has been sown before us. With all our supporters help, we continue to sow and we see the truth of this statement in the progress made, preservation captured and the programs and events held at the Strong Family Farm! The Year in Review

Community Outreach -

The farm acts as a meeting place for community organizations. Monthly the 4-H Hop-A-Long Gang Club meets at the farm. We always participate and support Vernon's National Night Out in August. Girl Scout Troop #10715, who have been with us since the beginning, held their Earth Day Roadside Clean Up Day meeting place at the farm. This year after the Chicken Run on May 15th we participated at Center Road School's Spring Fling where we passed out farm backpacks to all students present. We went with our former Clucky T. Rooster who had just returned from college. Strong Family Farm is an active member of Vernon Volunteers Collaborative, a group of 13 nonprofits in Town that meet 4 times a year to discuss our organizations activities and collaborate.

Business Development -

Membership: As of June 30, 2021, we have a total of 258 memberships.

<u>Fundraising:</u> This year we received a total of \$12,878 in membership donations, \$16,435 from individual contributions. Because of COVID precautions, we held two 5K Chicken Runs in this fiscal year with an income of \$8,892. We continue to put plaques on the rails and posts of the fence surrounding the farm. The bee replacement fundraising was very popular raising over \$700 to replace our bees.

<u>Grants</u>: This year we received two grants. One was from the CT Cultural Fund Operating Support Grant and one from the CT Summer at the Museum Grant. Both are administered by CT Humanities. These enabled us to hire a program director and offer programing free to all who visit the farm on Sundays during the summer.

<u>Staff and Hiring</u>: We want to thank Judy Olivieri for her continued dedication to running the farm store and Liz Bologna for administering our website, newsletters, press releases and social media. Our new hire this year is Katie Riordan Napolitan. She is doing a great job at developing programming and executing programming on Sundays here at the farm.

Volunteers and RHS ASTE Students; Strong Family Farm would have a hard time surviving without its faithful volunteers from all over our community. Besides individuals who give up their time to work and support us, we pull in volunteer groups from all over including 4-H Clubs, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Summer Church Camps, CERT, Vernon Explorers and Rockville, Tolland, East Catholic High Schools community service students. Weekly, our Rockville High School Agriculture Science Technology Education program students were Jacob Niemczyk and Olivia MacFarland. We say goodbye to Jacob who graduated and is off to the University of CT majoring in Natural Science and Resources. Emma Skidgel, Jill Booney, and Ava Reid all joined us this year as freshmen and are very enthusiastic and hard workers.

<u>Strategic Planning:</u> A planning meeting was help to start work on our Strategic Plan in May. We thank Laurie Bajorek and Jen Smith for their guidance and we will continue this in 2022-23.

Buildings and Land-

<u>Memorial Fence:</u> We continue to offer fence rails and posts for people to donate to support the farm, to honor of someone or as a memorial. This year we placed plaques on 15 more rail and 2 posts. There are still a few posts available and many rails if anyone is interested.

<u>Bees</u>: We harvested our own honey! Over 2 gallons came out of our hives. Thanks so much to Walt Moody, Walt's Bees, for facilitating this and also the restocking of the hives this year and educational talks. It is a labor of love.

<u>The Pasture Land:</u> Hytone Farm in Coventry just finished up their second year of bringing the farmland back to prime agricultural land. Many notice a new smell in Town! We employ the help of Robert Arthur to keep the trails open and brush cleared on other parcels of land, as well as behind the barn. Morgan Strong has put a stone bench at the top of Meetinghouse Hill so people can sit and enjoy the view.

Annual Features and Programs-

<u>Chicken Run:</u> This fiscal year we had two Chicken Runs due to COVID precautions. The September run brought out more runners than we ever had and the May event was well attended. We want to thank the sponsors for stepping up and sponsoring us twice in one fiscal year. We have the best followers.

<u>Farm Store:</u> Every year the customer base at the store goes up. It is the place for fresh CT Grown and produced items, which lacks in Vernon. This year we have partnered with Mon Soleil Farm in Union to offer Community Supported Agriculture shares to our community that so lacks in the offering of fresh picked vegetables and greens.

<u>Backyard Chicken:</u> This is the 9th year of Alexis Carmicheal's Backyard Chicken Program here at the farm and we have a full house again this year. Families come every other Wednesday to have a chicken lesson, a chicken game or craft and then visiting the chickens while exploring the berry bushes for goodie for them and the "girls".

<u>CT Open House</u>: June 11th was the first CT Open House Day since COVID and was well attended by the public. We had the store open for people to see, activities for all and farm tours were held.

Raised Bed Gardening: Raised bed gardens were as popular as ever in 2021-22 with Master Gardener Dan Gallagher being ever present on Wednesdays giving gardening advice. Claudia Steele did a canning workshop for our members. This year Cecily

Robinson adopted the compost bins and extra garden. It is hard work, but Cecily enjoys talking about it, doing it and having the farm to come to. We thank her for her hard work.

<u>Kids' Civil War Camp:</u> Unfortunately, our organizer, Frank Niederwerfer, could not rally the troops to put on the Civil War Kid's Camp this year, but we are beginning to plan for May of 2023.

<u>Community Tag Sale:</u> In early June, people put their junk in their trunk and rented a space in our field for a community tag sale. Our store and tag sale room were open and well attended.

<u>Scarecrow Contest:</u> The 9th Annual Scarecrow Contest was a success again this year with more creative and interesting scarecrows adorning the farm on the fence line. We are looking forward to a big celebration this coming fall making it 10 years of scarecrows!

<u>Harvest Festival:</u> The Harvest Festival was cancelled again due to COVID concerns. We are looking forward to a bigger, better festival on October 22, 2022.

Special Projects-

<u>Sunday Summer Events:</u> Starting June 17th, Program Director Katie Riordan has Sunday programs at the farm from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. Anywhere from 65 to 100 people have come to participate in the crafts and see our visiting animals.

Eagle Scout Projects: We are honored this year to have been chosen the site for two Eagle Scout Projects at the farm. These are amazing young men from Troop 27 in Manchester who have to project plan, facilitate and direct the project of their choice. Ryan Brown chose to make the trail and create a parking area at the Meetinghouse Hill pasture. Ron LoCicero took down the falling down chicken coop, leveled the ground and fundraised to purchase a garden shed in a similar design for us from Kloter Farms.

<u>Strong Family Farm Children's Book:</u> Lori Sanchez, our long time "Author in Residence" finished and publish a story in her series entitled *Finding Friends Everywhere at Strong Family Farm.* Many of her books reference the farm, but this is the first one to focus on a visit to the farm. It's for sale in the farm store.

For the period July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 The major financial highlights for the fiscal year are:

- -Available cash at the end of the fiscal year is \$101,730, up \$4,195 from last year.
- -Many thanks to Laurie Bajorek in stepping up to assist in data entry into QuickBooks during the store season.
- -Town re-evaluation saw an increase of \$26,610 in the value of the Strong Family Farm preserved pasture land.
- -Two grants to help with programming received through CT Humanities were secured.
- -IRA distributions were received from two members this year who see the value of preserving the farm for the future.
- -IRS 990 was completed and filed in time with the help of our friend and volunteer CPA Michalina Pietras.
- -Funds were saved this year with a vacancy in the position of Executive Director.
- -Our goal in the coming years is to secure a strategic plan for the future and apply for grants to facilitate the needs to accomplish the goals.
